4. WRITING

Writing and reading go together! Once children have the ability to hold a marker or a thick crayon, give them plenty of opportunities to draw and write. Drawing and the beginnings of writing teach the brain to communicate language through symbols and that letters and words stand for sounds and print has meaning.
