A great deal of anxiety and distress has been caused the parents and friends of Sapper Chas. G. Brooks and Sapper Roy Wells, by the reports in Saturday's Toronto papers that, these young men had been killed in action in France, when such was not the case. Sapper Brooks' parents re-

Sapper Brooks' parents received word on Friday that their, son, Charles Gilbert, had beenadmitted to No. 9 General hospital, Rouen, on March 21st, suffering from gunshot wound in right leg: Sapper Brooks, along with his brother, Lee-Cpl. Geo. Brookes enlisted in December, 1915, with the Aurora company of the 127th Battalion, crossed to England in Aug. 1916, and landed in France in January, -917. He was born at Hackney, Londou, England, coming to Canada when a lad. He was 20 years of age.

years of age. Sapper W. A. Westbeare of former resident of King Township, where his mother and brother at present reside. So far as can be learned they have received no notification of his being wounded. He enlisted in the West and was transferred to the 127th Battalion. Sapper W. A. Westbeart of the Aurora company of the 127th has also been reported as wounded. Before enlisting he was employed at the T. Sisman Shoe Co.

Lee-Cpl. T. H. Bovair, son of Mrt and Mrs. Peter Bovair, of-King Township, has been reported wounded. The cofficial notification to his parents states that he was admitted to No. 6 hospital, France, on April 1st suffering from gunshot wound in the side. A later cable from a private source states that the wound is not dangerous and he is progressing favorably. Lee. Corpl.
