Private Elwood Crossley was discharged because of demobilization. He served in Canada, England and France. On his discharge papers, he was cited as having good conduct and was awarded the British War and Victory Medals.

## AFTER THE WAR

**1921 Census**

Age 25

Worked as a labourer and lived in King, Ontario with William Crossley (head of house – father, age 50), Florence Crossley (mother, age 50), Carlton Crossley (brother, age 29), Edna Crossley (sister, age 23), William Crossley (brother, age 15) and Leona Stone (sister, age 27).

**Apr 30, 1923**

Age 27

**Aug 5, 1930**

Age 33

Married Muriel Elliott (age 21), daughter of George and Margaret Emmaline (Mountain) Elliott. At the time of their wedding, Elwood worked as a metal lather.

Elwood divorced Muriel Elliott and got married to Maud Antoinette Poole (age 20), daughter of Kenneth and Margaret Poole of Newfoundland. The wedding took place in Halifax, Nova Scotia.
