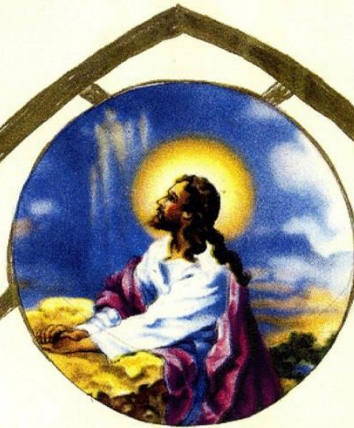
Sergeant Wilfred Laurier Doyle died. He is remembered at the *Menin Gates (Ypres) Memorial* in Belgium.
