Corporal Michael Duggan was wounded and was left with a compound fracture on left femur and had to wear a splint until February 1919.

Gunshot wound in his left thigh.

Jun 30, 1919

Age 21

He was sent back to Canada.

Oct 29, 1919

Age 23

Corporal Michael Duggan was discharged because he was deemed medically unfit. He received the Military Medal for Gallantry from George V.

Sep 19, 1922

Age 25

Married Ann Mae Shrubsole daughter of John and Agnes Kelly Shrubsole of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The couple had 8 children: Marie, Paul, Therese, Sheila, Adrienne, Patricia, Annette and Michael Duggan.

1957 Age 60 Appointed a Knight of St. Sylvester by Pope Pius XII, an honour which is rarely given to a layman.

1962 Age 62 Retired from the position of Chief Accountant at Canadian Press after forty years.

Sep 19, 1972

Mr. and Mrs. Duggan celebrated their Golden wedding anniversary.

Oct 10, 1980

Michael James Duggan died at Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto and is buried in Mount Hope Cemetery.
