Feb 19, 1894

Born in Loydstown, Ontario to James "Old Jim" and Emma Rose (Smith) Duggan. Sherman's half nephew was **Michael James Duggan**. Sherman's father, James "Old Jim" Duggan was Michael's grandfather.

Age 76

Sherman died at the age 76 in North Bay, Ontario.

The marriage of Emilie, daughter of Mrs. T. von Zuben, to Sherman Duggan, son of the late James Duggan of Schomberg, was solemnized at St. Basil's Church, the Rev. L. Hayes officiating. The bride, who was given away by her uncle, Mr. F. Kahnert, wore a gown of ivory charmeuse and gold lace with veil and wreath of orange blossoms and carried a bouquet of sunset roses. Her sister, Antoinette, attended as bridesmaid, wearing a gown of orchid georgette with hat to match, and carried Ophelia roses. Mr. Michael Duggan assisted as best man. The wedding music was played by Mr. D. A. Morel. After the ceremony a reception was held at the home of the bride's mother, 394 Huron st. Mr. and Mrs. Duggan left for a short trip to Ottawa and Montreal, and on their return will make their home in Timmins, Ont.
