

Roger Gellatly, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robt. Gellatly of King. The bride, who was given away by her father, wore orchid georgette with silver ribbon and carried Ophella roses. Miss Helen Coulter was her sister's bridesmaid, and Mr. Harvey Gellatly was his brother's best man. The happy couple left later for a honeymoon in Muskoka, the bride going away in a navy-blue tricoline sait and leghorn hat with French flowers.
