Born in Lloydtown, Ontario to Alfred Levi and Elizabeth Anne (Srigley) Lloyd.

Age 21

Wounded at Courcellette, France and was sent to England until September 1917.

Came to Canada to the hospital and remained at Christie Street until 1921, where he made a miraculous recovery.

Oct 29, 1921

Age 26

Married Leila Jean Campbell (age 25), daughter of Duncan and Mary (Broom) Campbell of Newmarket, Ontario.

Jun 24, 1924

Age 26

Leila Lloyd (Ewart's wife, age 27) died at the Wellesley Hospital in Toronto, Ontario.

Date Unknown

Ewart eventually remarried after his first wife's death. His second wife was Mildred Ferguson. They had 4 children together: Blake, Betty, Grant and Sheila Lloyd.

1949 Voter List

Age 54

Worked as a postmaster in Schomberg. He lived with his wife Mildred.

Dec 15, 1950

Age 55

Ewart died at age 55 at York County Hospital. He is buried at the Schomberg Union Friends Cemetery in Schomberg, Ontario.

GLADSTONE LLOYD is one of Schomberg's leading young business men. He is the son of Alf. Lloyd, of Loyalist descent, of Lloydtown. Gladstone obtained his education at Lloydtown public school, Schomberg continuation school, Newmarket high school and one year at S.P.S., Toronto. The War interrupted his college career, for he enlisted in August, 1915, and went overseas in December of that year. He was wounded at Courcellette, October 25, 1916, and was sent to England till September, 1917, when he returned to France, to be soon sent back to Blighty. He came to Canada to the hospital in April, 1919, remaining in Christie Street till 1922, having spent over five years in the hospitals. However, he has made a miraculous recovery. From Toronto, he went to Alliston to a chicken farm for two years, and, in 1924, came to Schomberg as postmaster. He is also an agent for the Sun Life Assurance. He is an adherent of the United Church and, in politics, is a Liberal.

E. Gladstone Lloyd Of Schomberg Dies

Funeral services for E. Gladstone Lloyd, 55, Schomberg's postmaster for more than 25 years, was held Monday at Schomberg United church, conducted by Rev. Gordon C. Hunter. Interment was in Union cemetery Schomberg.

Mr. Lloyd died Friday from a heart ailment at York County Memorial hospital, Newmarket. A veteran of World War I, he served in France with the Canadian Field Artillery and in World War II held the rank of lieutenant with the signals division of the reserve force of the Queen's York Rangers reserves.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Lloyd of Schomberg, he was born at nearby Lloydtown. A prominent figure in village activity, Mr. Lloyd for many years was a local sports promoter and was actively associated with Schomberg's baseball clubs. He was a member of the Lions club, the Union Masonic lodge, a former secretary-treasurer of the school board for 20 years, and a member of the United church. He had earlier served as a village commissioner and was a former chief of the local fire department.

Surviving are his widow, the former Mildred Ferguson; two sons, Blake, stationed with the R.C.A.F. at Summerside, P.E.I., and Grant, at home; and two daughters, Betty and Sheila, at home; his parents, and a sister, Mrs. Harry Carter of Schomberg.
