

MACLEOD, ANGUS HENRY



EARLY LIFE

Apr 8, 1893
Date Unknown

Born in Lambton County, Ontario to John and Jane (Cunningham) MacLeod.
Enrolled at the Ontario Veterinary College in Toronto, Ontario.

MILITARY SERVICE

1915

Age 22

Joined the army but was returned to college along with a number of senior students to complete his studies. One month later, he joined the officers' training corps at the University of Toronto, taking such course in conjunction with his college duties, thus receiving his efficiency certificate as an officer in the infantry along with his degree from the Veterinary College.

Date Unknown

Went overseas and transferred to the Imperial Army as a lieutenant in the Royal Army Veterinary Corps and sent to Egypt.

Jun 1917

Age 24

Made captain in the 60th Division in the Egyptian Expeditionary Force.

AFTER THE WAR

1920

Age 27

Returned to Canada and transferred to the Canadian Army and placed on the reserve of officers.

May 1921

Age 28

Went to London, England to marry Winnifred Clark.

Nov 1925

Age 32

Winnifred (Clark) MacLeod died.

Jun 26, 1928

Age 35

Married Isabel Fox (age 20), daughter of Geoffrey and Lucy Amelia (Hurst) Fox. At the time of the wedding Angus worked as a veterinary surgeon and Isabel worked as a stenographer.

1944

Age 51

Angus died and is buried in Schomberg Union Friends Cemetery in Schomberg, Ontario.

ANGUS HENRY MACLEOD, is of Scotch descent. He was born on the shores of Lake Huron, Lambton County, in 1893. He attended school there and in Forest. After farming for a few years at home, he enrolled at the Ontario Veterinary College, Toronto. In 1915 he joined the army, but was returned to college along with a number of senior students to complete his studies. One month later, he joined the officers' training corps at the University, taking such course in conjunction with his college duties, thereby receiving his efficiency certificate as an officer in the infantry along with his degree from the Veterinary College. This was in 1916. He then went overseas, where he was transferred to the Imperial Army as a lieutenant in the Royal Army Veterinary Corps and sent to Egypt. He served on transport duty between Egypt and Greece and later was attached to the 28th Division in Macedonia. In June, 1917, he was made captain in the 60th Division in the Egyptian Expeditionary

Force, crossed the Arabian Desert and entered Palestine. This Division, owing to the active part taken and the position occupied in the capture of Jerusalem, was presented with the key to Jerusalem by General Allenby. The following year, 1918, this Division advanced through Syria, Asia Minor, to the Taurus Mountains, when the Armistice was signed. During this attack, Dr. MacLeod contracted malaria and was invalided to England in June, 1919. While convalescing, he visited Paris and the battlefields of France.

In 1920 the doctor was returned to Canada and transferred to the Canadian Army, where he was placed on the reserve of officers. This year saw his advent to Schomberg as a Veterinary Surgeon.

In May, 1921, he journeyed to London, England, where he married Gladys Winnifred Clark, of that city. On his return, he took up his residence on King Street. After a short but happy married life, Mrs. MacLeod died in November, 1925.

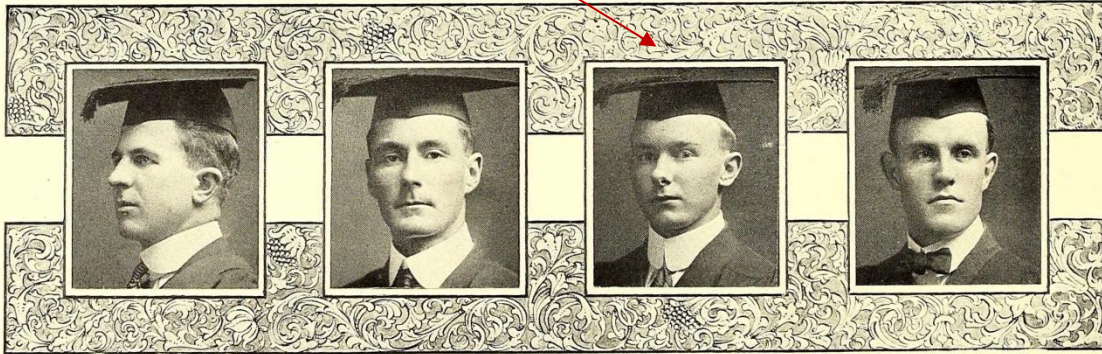
Dr. MacLeod has been Secretary-Treasurer of the Agricultural Society for the past eight years, and enjoys a very extensive practice.
