Married Mabel Gertrude Clarkson (age 27). They had 9 children together: Olive, Jim, Ann, Atwood, John, Helen, Shirley, Walter and Lorna.

Worked as a truck driver and lived in Nobleton with his wife Mabel who was a receptionist.

Jul 24, 1975

Age 79

Hugh was the victim in a hit and run accident on Highway 9 (east of Schomberg). The hit and run driver eventually turned himself in and was forced to pay 100\$.

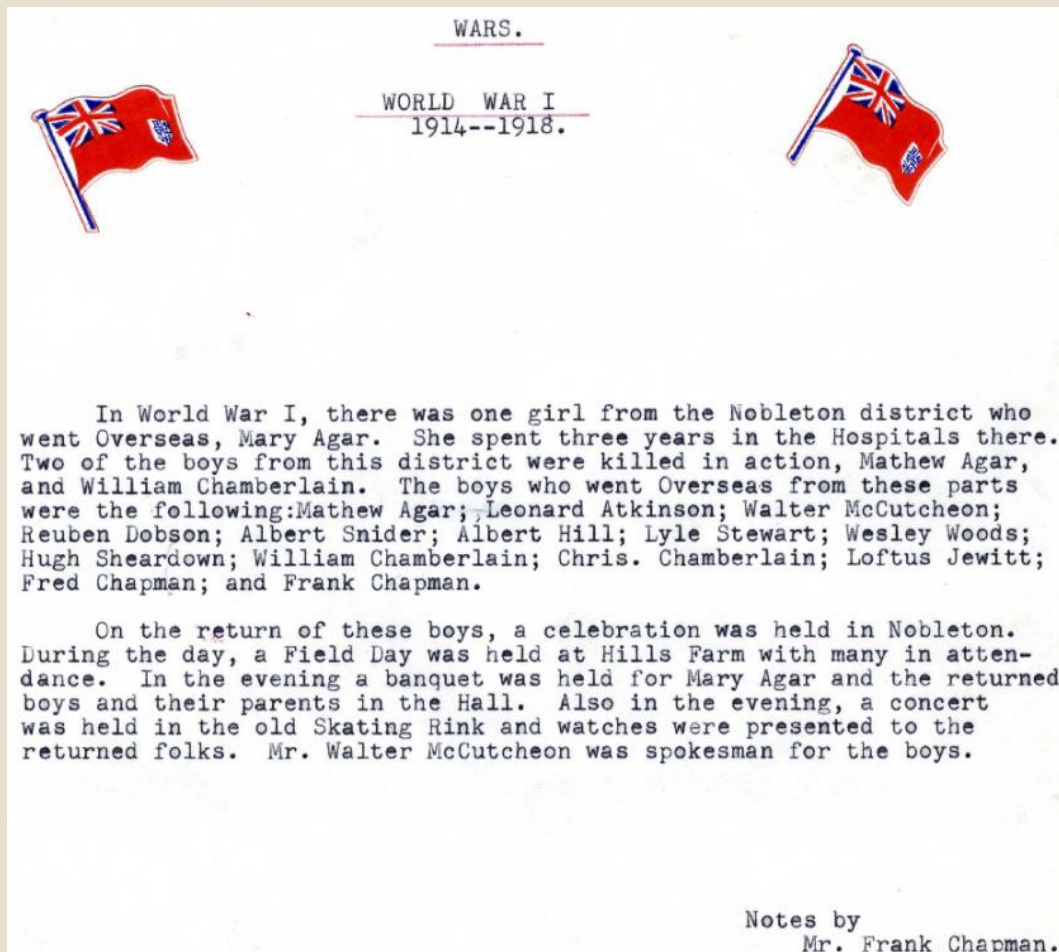
Aug 11, 1975

Age 79

Hugh died at York County Hospital in Newmarket, Ontario after succumbing to his injuries from the hit and run. He is buried in the Nobleton Community Cemetery in Nobleton, Ontario.

This board cleaned the old cemetery to its proper condition, but the project was unfortunately not followed through. Still under the Institute, another public meeting was held on June 7, 1954 and Gordon Broad was elected as the president of the new Cemetery Board. He was assisted by Lyman Davis, Gilbert Faris, Fred Ascott, Howard Wellar, Hugh Sheardownne, and Harold Rose. These men each donated one hundred dollars in order to have the grounds surveyed and new burial plots set aside. In addition, approximately one half an acre was donated By Thomas Dodson in 1954 and as well the Board purchased more property from the Estate of the late Thomas Breedon to increase the area of the new Cemetery.

Suspect turns self in after hit-run mishap

OAK RIDGES — A Downsview man has been charged with failing to remain at the scene of an accident after turning himself in to Ontario Provincial Police here last week.

Robert Mitchell Harvey, 19, of Wilson Ave., Downsview, was charged as the result of a hit-and-run accident July 24 east of Schomberg.

Mr. Mitchell turned himself in Thursday evening through his lawyer.

Hugh Sheardown, 79, of R. R. 1 Schomberg, suffered serious injuries in that mishap when struck by a green Ford pickup truck on Highway 9 east of Schomberg.

He was reported in guarded condition in York County

Hospital's Intensive Care unit Monday.

OPP said Monday that they were preparing to check registration records for all light green Ford trucks registered in the province in an attempt to find the wanted vehicle.

They also reported "numerous calls" from the public reporting vehicles matching the description of the wanted truck.

"Many concerned and public minded citizens contacted the police who investigated all information received," OPP officials said Monday.

They noted that had the driver of the vehicle stopped at the time of the accident, no charges would have been laid.

Mr. Harvey will appear in Newmarket Provincial Court Monday.

Driver in hit, run fatality fined \$100

NEWMARKET — The driver of a hit-and-run vehicle which fatally injured a 79-year-old Schomberg man was fined \$100 and given 60 days to pay in provincial court here last week.

Robert Mitchell Harvey, 19, of Downsview, had pleaded

guilty last month to a charge of failing to remain at the scene of an accident.

On the day of Mr. Harvey's guilty plea, Hugh Sheardown of R. R. 1, Schomberg, died in York County Hospital of injuries suffered in the July 24 mishap on Hwy. 9, west of Hwy. 27.

Hit-and-run driver gave himself up is fined \$100

NEWMARKET — Robert Mitchell Harvey, 19, of Wilson Ave., Downsview, was fined \$100 or 10 days in jail yesterday after pleading guilty a month ago to failing to remain at the scene of an accident in which a 79-year-old Schomberg man later died.

Harvey was convicted Aug. 11 in Newmarket Provincial Court by Judge Clare Morrison, who has since left the bench to run as a Liberal candidate in Durham North. Harvey was sentenced yesterday by Judge Ian Munro, who gave him 60 days to pay his fine.

Hugh Sheardown of R. R. 1, Schomberg, was struck by a pick-up truck on Highway 9 near his home on July 24. The truck failed to stop.

The Ontario Provincial Police at Oak Ridges conducted an intensive search for the wanted truck and its driver throughout southern and central Ontario.

About a week after the accident Harvey gave himself up.

Sheardown died from his injuries in York County Hospital on Aug. 11—the day Harvey pleaded guilty.
