GEORGE STONE DIES IN FALL FROM TRAIN

A large number of Aurora people and war veterans attended the funeral, on Tuesday, at King of the late George Stone. Mr. Stone, who was in his 47th year, was fatally injured as the result of a heart stack early Sunday morning when he fell from the rear coach of the hunting special at Torrance near Baiz. Mr. Stone, as was his yearly custom, was going north to Magnetewan with a party of friends for the hunting season.
