NELSON WAUCHOPE is a descendant of Old Land stock, his grandfather being born in Scotland and his grandmother in Ireland. As early settlers, they located on a farm near the village of Nobleton.

Samuel, son of these pioneers, was born in 1853. His wife was Maria McDonald, of King Township. During the early years of their married life, they lived in Artemesia Township, in Albion Township near Bolton, and in Toronto, but in 1902 located on lot 18, concession 10, King, where they remained nineteen years.

Their children were Robert (deceased), Thomas, Grace (Mrs. L. Sheardown), Arthur, Sarah (Mrs. F. Westlake) and Nelson.

Nelson was born in April, 1896. In 1920, he married Pearl, a daughter of John Lynn. He was in the Great War in 1918. After he married, he bought lot 28, concession 8, King, where he still resides. He is at present one of the Board of Trustees for Schomberg school. His family consists of two boys and one girl, Clifford, Jack and Joyce.
